# THE UNIVERSITY

One of five campuses of the University of Minnesota, the University of Minnesota-Duluth offers a small college atmosphere with a university setting.

UMD's enrollment this fall is expected to exceed 5,000 students. Its academic offerings include 50 majors in 32 academic areas, as well as graduate study in 15 subjects. The basic science program in medicine, the dental hygiene program and the Graduate School of Social Work are all in their second years.

The campus, developed since UMD's establishment in 1947, represents an investment of more than \$43 million in land and buildings. Among new structures scheduled to open during this academic year are the Performing Arts building, a residence hall dining area, a 312-student apartment building near the Griggs Stadium and a new Classroom-Laboratory building. Ground was broken this summer for a \$1.7 million Physical Education Fieldhouse, just south of the stadium.

UMD offers its students opportunities both in and out of the classroom. Taking advantage of the unique and beautiful Northern Minnesota environment, UMD offers such classes as sailing on Lake Superior, wintertime ski courses on the campus ski hill, biology study at the natural arboretum and the man-made lake on campus, a summer biology tour using a mobile laboratory, geology field trips and others. There are also increasing opportunities for students to pursue internships with community agencies for college credit. Complementing the academics is a full program of extra-curricular activities ranging from intramurals to music organizations to 100 special interest student groups. The Kirby Student Center features several lounge and recreation areas where a host of programs and events are scheduled weekly by the student program board.

# THE ATHLETIC STAFF



## DIRECTOR

UMD Athletic Director Ralph Romano, eyeing excellence in UMD's 11 sport program, is in his fifth year as the head of the department.

A native of Thunderbay, Ontario, Romano moved to Duluth while in high school. He graduated from Duluth Central and continued his education at UMD. While at UMD, he was a goalie with the Bulldog hockey squad.

Following graduation in 1956 he served as a navigator in the Air Force. Romano returned to his alma mater in 1959 as head hockey coach and sports publicity director. He soon took on the responsibilities of athletic ticket manager and athletic business manager as well as continuing the coaching. He relinquished his coaching job in 1967 while accepting a position as UMD assistant athletic director.

The retirement of Lloyd Peterson, a long time servant of UMD athletics, vacated the UMD athletic director's seat and Romano was the logical candidate for the job.

## BUSINESS MANAGER—S.I.D.

Bruce McLeod a former Bulldog hockey great, is in his second year as Romano's top assistant. McLeod, a native of Fort Frances, Ontario, is a jack-of-all trades with responsibilities in the financial and publicity areas as well as assisting the athletic director with his duties.

## SENIOR SECRETARY

Kathy Erickson has moved into special projects as well as her regular secretarial duties. Miss Erickson handles season tickets in all sports, the North Star Scholarship Program, summer camp programs, all financial ticket records, the aid and eligibility situations.

## EQUIPMENT MANAGER

Clarence Hillman is in his second season of responsibility for all Bulldog team equipment as well as locker room control. Hillman's duties include inventory and control.



# THE CAMPUS RELATIONSHIP

## ATHLETICS COMMITTEE

The Athletics Committee, made up of administration, faculty, students, and alumni has the responsibility of recommending policy pertaining to the athletic program, rule on eligibility status of students, approve all schedule of intercollegiate sports event, and coordinate the athletic program with the academic program.

## FACULTY REPRESENTATIVE

Dr. Richard W. Ojakangas, who holds the rank of full professor in the Geology Department, represents UMD as it's faculty-representative to the MIAC and WCHA. Dr. Ojakangas a native Minnesotan, who was born in Moose Lake and graduated from Grand Rapids High School, has a long time interest in athletics dating back to track and cross country participation in high school and college. He earned his Ph.D. from Stanford in 1964 following an academic record that included study at the University of Helsinki, Finland; an M.A. degree from the University of Missouri and a B.A. degree at U.M.D. Dr. Ojakangas' wife Beatrice is a nationally known nutritionist and author of Finnish Cookbooks.

## RADIO PLAY BY PLAY

Bulldog fans can follow their teams through the voices of local sportscasters Bob Junkert (WDSM-710) and Marsh Nelson (KDAL-610). These two veteran sportscasters cover many Bulldog athletic events both home and away, not only providing coverage but giving fans an opportunity to sample two viewpoints.

# FOOTBALL COACHING STAFF

## HEAD COACH

Jim Malosky, dean of MIAC coaches, begins his 16th season at the Bulldog helm.

With a career record at UMD of 78-51-7, Malosky has the best won-lost percentage of UMD's three all-time coaches. He led the Bulldogs to MIAC championships in 1960 and 1961, and has consistently challenged for the title.

Malosky earned his reputation as a winning coach at Edina-Morningside High School and Morris High School. His 1956 Morris team won its conference championship and in 1957, Malosky's Edina Hornets were considered the number one high school team in the state after sweeping through the season undefeated.

Overall, Malosky's high school coaching credentials read 27 victories and just eight losses.

Malosky a native of Crosby, Minn. was a standout football and basketball player at Crosby-Ironton High School. He was selected to the All-State teams in both sports.

Highly recruited by colleges across the nation, Malosky elected to attend the University of Minnesota, where he became Bernie Bierman's quarterback on the great Gopher teams of the late 1940's.

Malosky was recently promoted to associate professor of physical education at UMD.

## ASSISTANT COACHES

All-MIAC center Scott Hanna, assisted by John Economos, a former end; and Todd Anderson, a defensive back, will help round out the 1973 coaching staff. This trio will be joined by three year man Bill Lippitt a former Bulldog tackle.

## TRAINER

Don Roach will be starting his fourth year as a full time trainer at UMD. Roach who has also served as an assistant coach in the past, joined the Bulldog athletic staff in 1970 after completing his masters degree at Indiana University.

## PROSPECTS

The defensive line and offensive backfield are the strengths, the defensive backfield is solid but there are questions in the offensive line and concern about the linebacking.

On offense, the backfield returns nearly intact. The only one missing is semi-regular Frank Spanish (57 att.-226 yards) and backup quarterback Gary Milich. Returning regulars are senior quarterback Darrell McKibbon (85 att.-48 comp. 11 T.D.'s), sophomore halfback Terry Egerdahl (91 att.-390 yards), senior halfback Tim Moynihan (94 att.-508 yards), and senior fullback Eric Kaiser (111 att.-415 yards). This group is backed by real depth in Freeman Potter, the fifth leading ground gainer and Dale Kusnierek, an outstanding punt and kick return man with breakaway speed. The only question is the condition of Kaiser's knee, which was operated on following an injury in the last game of the 1972 season.

The offensive line will have to undergo a major revamping. Gone are split end Greg Polich, tight end John Economos, guard Eric Hanson, and All-Conference center Scott Hanna. The only regulars returning are junior guard John Rentschler and senior tackles Walt Vasil and Scott Lyons, who also plays in the defensive line.

The defensive line returns five who played there last year. They include senior Mike Staum and junior Lee Laursen at the ends and seniors Scott Lyons, Richard Hogue and Greg Ujdur inside.

Malosky's biggest worry may be at the linebacking position. Gone are All-Conference selection Steve Skildum, Jim Jablonski, and Billy Bye. Back is junior John Christensen. Two cornerbacks, junior Bill Spray and sophomore Jim Bye return but Todd Anderson has graduated. At the safety positions Gary Milich is gone and junior Mark Johnson returns. With limited experience Jim Ridinger, Rod Tafelski, John Casey and Barry Becklin will have to do the job of shoring up the linebacking spot.

Tri-captains Darrell McKibbon, Scott Lyons, and Eric Kaiser will lead the Bulldogs
