1 IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

When using your telephone equipment, basic safety precautions should always be followed to reduce the risk of fire, electric shock and injury, including the following:

- 1) Read and understand all the instructions.
- 2) Follow all warnings and instructions marked on the product.
- 3) Unplug this product from the wall outlet before cleaning. Do not use liquid cleaners or aerosol cleaners. Use a damp cloth for cleaning.
- 4) Do not use this product near water (for example, near a bath tub, kitchen sink, swimming pool).
- 5) Do not expose the telephone to direct sunlight or extreme cold environment. Do not put the telephone close to a heating source such as radiators, cookers, etc.
- 6) Do not overload wall outlets and extension cords as this can result in the risk of fire or electric shock.
- 7) NEVER use your phone outdoors during a thunderstorm-unplug the base from the telephone line and the mains socket when there are storms in your area.
- 8) Do not use the telephone to report a gas leak in the vicinity of the leak.
- 9) Use only the supplied NiMH (Nickel Metal Hydride) batteries! The operation periods for the handsets are only applicable with the default battery capacities.
- 10) The use of other battery types or non-rechargeable batteries can be dangerous. These may cause interference and/or unit damages. The manufacturer will not be held liable for damage arising from such noncompliance.
- 11) Do not use third party chargers. The batteries may be damaged.
- 12) Please note the correct polarity while inserting the batteries.
- 13) Dispose of batteries safely. Do not immerse them in water, burn them, or put them where they could get punctured.

1.1 Package Contents

- 1 Telephone line cord
- 2 rechargeable batteries
- 1 User's guide
- 1 Telephone connector

Please read this guide carefully to get to know the main features of your Twist 212, and read the safety instructions before using it. We also invite you to share the safety guidelines contained in this guide with all family members, and especially children.

1.2 Precautions

As with all radio communications, the signal quality will depend on the location and environment of the base and handset.

Your Twist 212 must be kept away from sources of excessive heat (radiators, direct sunlight, etc.) and protected against vibrations and dust. Never allow your telephone to come into contact with water or other liquids, or with aerosols.

To reduce the risk of interference and optimise reception, take particular care not to install the base in the immediate vicinity of windows, large metal objects, reinforced concrete, televisions, music centres, halogen lamps or heating devices, fluorescent lighting, burglar alarms, microwave ovens, computers, etc. To clean your set, use an antistatic cloth lightly moistened with water.

2 INSTALLING YOUR PHONE

2.1 Installing and Charging the Batteries


- 1. Slide down to open the battery compartment cover.
- 2. Place the 2 supplied AAA batteries as indicated. Pay extra attention to direction of polarity.
- 3. Slide the battery compartment cover back.
- 4. Put the handset on the base and charge for 15 hours before using the handset for the first time. The handset will give a beep when it is properly placed on the base or charger.

Note:

Only use rechargeable batteries with exactly the same specifications as those supplied with the product.


Using non-rechargeable or non-conforming batteries can damage the product and could pose a health hazard (see Chapter "Technical details").

Batteries can split or leak if incorrectly inserted, opened or exposed to heat. Never dispose of batteries in a fire: they could explode.



2.2 Connecting the Base Station

- 1. Plug one end of the telephone line cord into the telephone jack on base bottom.
- 2. Plug the small end of power adapter into a power jack on base bottom.
- 3. Connect the power supply plug to the base jack horizontally, and route the power supply cord through the slot.
- 4. Plug the large end of power adapter into a wall power outlet.
- 5. Plug the other end of the telephone line cord in to the telephone jack or micro-filter.
- 6. Always use the cables provided in the box.




2.3 Set the Handset Language

- 1. Press $\mathbb{Q}_{\mathsf{MENU}}^{\mathsf{CK}}$ and \mathbb{A}/∇ to select **HS SETTINGS**.
- 2. Press MKNU and ▲/▼ to select LANGUAGE.
- 3. Press $\frac{\Box K}{MENU}$ and \triangle/∇ to select the desired language.
- 4. Press $\frac{OK}{MENU}$ to confirm.

3 GETTING TO KNOW YOUR PHONE

3.1 Twist 212 Handset Overview

In idle mode: Press to access the main menu

In sub-menu mode: Press to confirm the selection

During a call: Press to access Intercom/Phonebook/Redial list/Call list

In main menu mode: Press to go back to idle screen

In sub-menu mode: Press to go back to previous level

In sub-menu mode: Press and hold to go back to idle screen In editing/predialing mode: Press to clear a character/digit

In editing/predialing mode: Press and hold to delete all the characters/

digits

During a call: Press to mute/unmute the microphone In idle mode: Press to intercom another handset In ringing: Press to suppress handset ringer

In menu mode: Press to scroll up the menu items



In Redial list/Call list/Phonebook entry: Press to make a call to the selected entry in the list

During ringing: Press to answer a call

3.2 Base Station Overview



1.

Press on the base station to page your handset. It will ring for approximately 60 seconds.

Press and hold **(** on the base station for about five seconds, the base station is entered into registration mode and allows handset registration.

2. .

Steadily on while the handset is charging or in use. (Applicable only when the LED I/O switch is slid to I')

Flash when receiving an incoming call. (Applicable only when the LED I/O switch is slid to "I")

3. LED I/O SWITCH (Bottom of the Base)

Slide the switch to "O" position to turn off the base LED Slide the switch to "I" position to turn on the base LED when the handset is charging on the base or in use

3.3 Display Icons and Symbols

The LCD display gives you information on the current status of the telephone.



- Steadily on when the handset is in range of the base. Flash when out of range of the base or not registered to the base.
- Steadily on when an intercom is in progress. Flash when there is an incoming internal call.
- Indicates a call is in progress.
- Indicate that handsfree is being used.
- Steadily on when an alarm is set. Flash when the alarm time set before reaches.
- Indicate that the keypad is locked.
- Indicate when there are new received Voice Message on Phonemail. Disappear when all the voice messages have been read.
- Indicate that the ringer is switched off.
- Indicate when the battery is fully charged.
 Whole icon flashes when the battery performs initial charging.
 Internal block icon flashes when the battery is in final charging stage.
- Indicate when the battery needs charging. Flash when low battery power level is detected.
- Indicate when more characters are existed before the text currently displayed.
- Indicate when more characters are existed after the text currently displayed.
- ★ Indicate when new call is received. Turn off when new call has been read.
- Scroll up/down the menu items/Phonebook list/Redial list/Call List.

4 USING YOUR PHONE

4.1 Make a Call

4.1.1 Preparatory Dialing

Enter the phone number and press \P or \P to dial the number. Press to clear the entry.

4.1.2 Direct Dialing

Press (or to take the line and enter the phone number.

4.1.3 Dial from Direct Memory Keys

In idle or off hook mode, press and hold 2/2 to dial the direct memory number. You have to store number to the related key first. See section 8.3.8 for reference.

4.1.4 Call from the Phonebook

4.1.5 Call from the Call List

Press \triangle to access the Call List and press \triangle/∇ to select the desired Call List entry. Press \bigcirc or \bigcirc to dial out to the selected Call List entry. Alternatively, press \bigcirc to access the Call List from the main menu.

4.1.6 Call Timer

Your handset automatically times the duration of every call. The call timer will display a few seconds after the call has made. It is shown in hours, minutes and seconds format (HH:MM:SS).

4.1.7 Call from the Redial List

Press ∇ to access the redial list and press \triangle/∇ to select the desired redial number. Press \bigcirc or \bigcirc to dial out to the selected redial number.

4.2 Answer a Call

If the handset is not on the charging cradle:

When the phone rings, press \(\bar{\cup}\) or \(\bar{\cup}\) to answer a call.

If the handset is on the base station and if **AUTO ANSWER** is set to ON: When the phone rings, pick up the handset to answer a call.

4.3 End a Call

During a call connection, press \nearrow to end the call. OR

Put the handset on the base station to end the call.

4.4 Adjust Earpiece and Handsfree Volume

There are 5 levels (**VOLUME 1** to **VOLUME 5**).

During a call:

Press \triangle/∇ to select volume 1-5. The current setting is shown. When you end the call, the setting will remain at the last selected level.

4.5 Mute a Call

You can talk to someone nearby without letting the caller hear you during a call.

During a call:

Press $\[\frac{\mathbb{C}/\mathbb{Q}}{\mathbb{N}^{T}} \]$ to mute the microphone and "**MUTED**" will display on the LCD. Your caller cannot hear you. Press $\[\frac{\mathbb{C}/\mathbb{Q}}{\mathbb{N}^{T}} \]$ again to unmute the microphone.

4.6 Set the Silent Mode

In idle mode, press and hold $\frac{*}{2}$ to turn off the handset ringer. The $\frac{1}{2}$ icon is displayed on the LCD.

In silent mode, press and hold $\mbox{\begin{tabular}{c} \sharp}$ to turn on the handset ringer. The $\mbox{\begin{tabular}{c} \sharp}$ icon will disappear.

4.7 Turn on the Keypad Lock

In idle mode, press and hold $\stackrel{*}{\textcircled{\ \ z}}$ to turn on the keypad lock. The $\stackrel{\bullet}{\bullet}$ icon is displayed on the LCD.

In keypad lock mode, if you press any key other than holding the ★ key, the screen will display "**KEYS LOCKED**" for around 2 seconds, and then "**HOLD** *" displays. You can press and hold ★ to turn off the keypad lock. The • icon will disappear.

4.8 Redial the Last Number

You can redial up to 10 of the last numbers called. If you have stored a name in the phonebook to go with the number, the name will be displayed instead. The most recent last number will display at the top of the redial list.

4.8.1 Redial a Number from the Redial List

- In idle mode, press ▼ to access the redial list.
 Remarks: If redial entry with name, press ‡ to view the number.
- Press A/▼ to browse the redial list.
- 3. Press \(\) or \(\) to dial to the selected redial number.

Note: If there are no numbers in the redial list, the display shows "**EMPTY**".

4.8.2 Store a Redial Number into the Phonebook

- 1. Follow Steps 1 and 2 in section 4.8.1.
- 2. Press $\frac{OK}{MENU}$ and \triangle/∇ to select **ADD TO PB**.
- 3. Press $\binom{OK}{MENUT}$ to enter the name.
- 4. Press of to store the redial number into the phonebook.
- 5. Press or to select phonebook melody.
- 6. Press ▲/▼ to browse the melody list. The respective melody will be played when browsing the melody list.
- 7. Press $\binom{OK}{MENL!}$ to confirm.

4.8.3 Delete a Redial Number

- 1. Follow Steps 1 and 2 in section 4.8.1.
- 2. Press OK and ▲/▼ to select **DELETE**.
- 3. Press of to confirm.

4.8.4 Delete the Entire Redial List

- 1. Follow Steps 1 and 2 in section 4.8.1.
- 2. Press MENU and \triangle/∇ to select **DELETE ALL**.
- 3. Press $\frac{\text{OK}}{\text{MENU}}$ to confirm.
- 4. Press $\frac{\square K}{MENU}$ to confirm again.

4.9 Find the Handset

You can locate the handset by pressing $\textcircled{\bullet}$ on the base station. All the handsets registered to the base will produce the paging tone and "**PAGING**" is displayed on the LCD. You can stop the paging by pressing $\textcircled{\bullet}/\textcircled{\bullet}/\textcircled{\bullet}/\textcircled{\bullet}$ on any handset or $\textcircled{\bullet}$ on the base again.

Note: If there is an incoming call during paging, the phone will ring with the incoming call instead of paging.

4.10 Make an Internal Call

This feature is only applicable when there are at least two registered handsets. It allows you to make internal calls, transfer external calls from one handset to another handset and make conference calls. If the called handset is not answered within 60 seconds, the called handset will stop ringing and the calling

handset will return to standby mode.

Note: If only one handset is registered to the base station, press will display "**NOT POSSIBLE**"

4.10.1 Intercom Another Handset

- 1. In idle mode, press $\frac{C}{NT}$ and the registered handsets will display except the calling handset.
- 2. Enter the desired handset number to intercom with.
- 3. The called handset rings and press \(\) on the called handset to establish the internal call.

Note: If only two handsets are registered to the base station, press will call another handset immediately.

4.10.2 Call All Handsets

- 1. In idle mode, press $\lceil \frac{C/Q}{NT} \rceil$ and the registered handsets will display.
- 2. Press (s) to ring to all registered handsets.

4.10.3 Transfer an External Call to another handset

During an external call:

- 1. Press \bigcap_{MENU}^{OK} and \triangle/∇ to select **INTERCOM**.
- 2. Press of to select the desired handset to intercom with.
- 3. The external call is put on hold automatically and the called handset rings.
- 4. Press \ on the called handset to establish an internal call.
- 5. Press on the calling handset or put the calling handset on the charging cradle to end the current call with the external party.
- 6. The external call is transferred to the called handset.

4.10.4 Make a 3-way Conference Call

The conference call feature allows one external call to be shared with two handsets (in intercom). The three parties can share the conversation and no network subscription is required.

During an external call:

- 1. Follow Steps 1 to 4 in section 4.10.3.
- 2. Press and hold 🐧 on the calling handset to establish the conference call.

Note: Any handset hangs up during a conference call will leave the other handset still in connection with the external call.

5 PHONEBOOK

Your phone can store up to 50 private phonebook entries with names and numbers. Each phonebook entry can have a maximum of 20 digits for the phone number and 12 characters for the name. You can also select different ringtones for your phonebook entries. Phonebook entries are stored alphabetically by name.

5.1 Add a New Phonebook Entry

In idle:

1. Press 🔯 to access the phonebook.

OR

Press $^{\square K}_{\text{MENU}}$ and \triangle/∇ to select **PHONEBOOK** main menu item and then press to access the phonebook.

- 2. Press of to select **ADD**.
- 3. Press $\begin{bmatrix} OK \\ MENU \end{bmatrix}$ to enter the name.
- 4. Press $\binom{OK}{MENU}$ to enter the number.
- 5. Press and ▲/▼ to select the desired ringtone for your phonebook entry.
- 6. Press (MENU) to store the phonebook entry.

5.2 Search a Phonebook Entry

In idle:

- 1. Press 👿 to access the phonebook.
- 2. Enter the first character of the name by multi-tap.

5.3 View a Phonebook Entry

In idle:

- 1. Press 🔯 to access the phonebook.
- 2. Press \triangle/∇ to select the desired phonebook entry.
- 3. Press MENU and ♠/▼ to select VIEW.
- 4. Press ☐K and ▲/▼ to review the name, number and melody of the selected phonebook entry.

Note: If number is more than 12 digits, press $\frac{\square K}{MENU}$ or $\frac{\lceil C/M \rceil}{NT}$ to view the remaining digits.

5.4 Edit a Phonebook Entry

In idle:

- 1. Press 👿 to access the phonebook.
- 2. Press \triangle/∇ to select the desired phonebook entry.
- 3. Press $\begin{bmatrix} OK \\ MENU \end{bmatrix}$ and \triangle/∇ to select **EDIT**.
- 4. Press of the selected phonebook entry displays.
- 5. Edit the name (press $\lceil \frac{C/Q}{NT} \rceil$ to delete a character) and press $\lceil \frac{C/Q}{NT} \rceil$.
- 6. Edit the number (press $\frac{C/R}{NT}$ to delete a digit) and press $\frac{C}{MENU}$.
- 7. Press \triangle/ ∇ to select the ringtone and press $\frac{\square K}{MENU}$ to confirm.

5.5 Delete a Phonebook Entry

In idle:

- 1. Press 🔯 to access the phonebook.
- 2. Press \triangle/∇ to select the desired phonebook entry.
- 3. Press $^{\square K}$ and \triangle/∇ to select **DELETE**.
- 4. Press MENU to confirm.

5.6 Delete the Entire Private Phonebook

- 1. Press 👿 to access the phonebook.
- 2. Press $\stackrel{OK}{\bowtie_{MENU}}$ and \triangle/ \triangledown to select **DELETE ALL**.
- 3. Press $\binom{OK}{MENU}$ to confirm.
- 4. Press or to re-confirm.

5.7 Check the Phonebook Usage

You can check how many phonebook entries have been occupied in your phone and how many phonebook entries are available for you to store in the phonebook.

- 1. Press 🔯 to access the phonebook.
- 2. Press ond ♠/▼ to select PB STATUS.
- 3. Press $\frac{\text{OK}}{\text{MENU}}$ to confirm.

6 CALLER DISPLAY

This feature is available if you have subscribed the Caller Line Identification service with Belgacom. Your phone can store up to 20 received calls with date/ time information in the Call List. The number will be shown on the LCD when the phone is ringing. If the number matches with one of the entries in your Private Phonebook, the caller's name stored in the private phonebook will be displayed alternatively with the number. The handset will ring with the melody associated with that phonebook entry.

If the caller number is disabled to send caller information, "**WITHHELD**" will display.

If the caller number is not provided, "**OUT OF AREA**" will display.

In standby, if three unanswered calls are received, "3 **NEW CALLS**" will be displayed.

6.1 View the Call List

All received calls are saved in Call List with the latest call putting at the top of the list. When the call list is full, the oldest call will be replaced by a new call. The unanswered call which has not been read is marked with a \star at the centre of the bottom line of the display.

1. Press **A** to access the call list.

OR

Press MENU and \triangle/∇ to select **CALL LIST**.

- 2. Press \triangle/∇ to select the desired entry.
- 3. Press # to view the caller's number if applicable.

6.2 Store a Call List Number into the Phonebook

- 1. Follow Steps 1 and 2 in Section 6.1.
- 2. Press MENU and ▲/▼ to select ADD TO PB.
- 3. Press $\frac{OK}{MENU}$ to enter the name.
- 4. Press $\frac{OK}{MENU}$ and the selected call list number is displayed.
- 5. Edit the number if necessary.
- 6. Press $\stackrel{\text{OK}}{\bowtie_{\text{MENU}}}$ and \triangle/∇ to select the melody.
- 7. Press $\frac{\square K}{MENU}$ to confirm.

6.3 Delete an Entry in the Call List

- 1. Follow Steps 1 and 2 in Section 6.1.
- 2. Press OK and ▲/▼ to select **DELETE**.
- 3. Press $\binom{OK}{MENU}$ to confirm.

6.4 Delete the Entire List of the Call List

- 1. Follow Steps 1 and 2 in Section 6.1.
- 2. Press $\frac{OK}{MENU}$ and \triangle/ \Rightarrow to select **DELETE ALL**.
- 3. Press $\frac{OK}{MENU}$ to confirm.
- 4. Press $\frac{OK}{MENU}$ to re-confirm.

6.5 View the Details of the Call List Entry

- 1. Follow Steps 1 and 2 in Section 6.1.
- 2. Press MENU and ▲/▼ to select **DETAILS**.
- 3. Press $\frac{OK}{MENU}$ to display the date and time of the selected call list entry.
- 4. Press (MENU) to go back to previous screen.

6.6 Set the Category of the Call List

You can choose to store the missed calls only or all incoming calls in call list.

- 1. Follow Steps 1 and 2 in Section 6.1.
- 2. Press \bigcap_{MENU}^{OK} and \triangle/∇ to select **CATEGORY**.
- 3. Press $\frac{OK}{MENU}$ and \triangle/∇ to select MISSED CALLS or ALL CALLS.
- 4. Press $\frac{OK}{MENU}$ to confirm.

7 PHONEMAIL

By subscription to Belgacom, you can have your calls diverted to Phonemail when you are absent. For more details, contact Belgacom.

When new messages are received, the icon appears on the screen. The **o** icon disappears once you have consulted the voicemail messages. If the icon doesn't disappear, press and hold during call list review will turn off the voicemail icon manually.

8 PHONE SETTINGS

Your phone comes with a selection of settings that you can change to personalize your phone the way you like it to work.

8.1 Date and Time Settings

You will need to set the correct time and date so that you know when you received call list entries.

8.1.1 Change the Date Format
