

#### NARRATIVE SUMMARY

# will to you GENERAL


- a. At the beginning of the period 3d Bn 3d Marines was in a defensive position within its TAOR conducting patrols and ambushes. The Battalion CP was located at (BT 566044). Extensive patrolling was conducted forward of the MIR with results varying from no contact to engagement with Viet Cong forces up to company size. Patrols were conducted twenty-four (24) hours a day, ranging from squad to company size. In addition numerous layouts and ambushes were established. Three combat outposts and a traffic control point were manned forward of the NLR. On 18-20 August the battalion participated in Operation STARLIGHT as one of the assault battalions. On 27 August 1965, 3d Bn 3d Marines was relieved in its MLR positions by the 1st Bn 7th Marines. The battalion moved into a tactical bivouac area as prescribed by 3d Bn 3d Marines Frag Order #35 Frag Order #35 was modified and two (2) platoons from Company "L" were assigned to assist Company "I" in airfield defense. 3d En 3d Marines retains operational control of both companies and is responsible for the airfield define in assigned sector. The Bn CP is located at (BT 530022). CP security is primited by H&S Company, one (1) platoon from Company "W" and the battalion's attached tank and Ontos platoons.
  - b. Aggressive civil affairs action. was aimed at the local hamlets within the TAOR. Whenever possible medical aid, food and gifts were distributed in areas of need. Noticeable achievements in the civil affairs program were evident as village searches and hamlet visits were net with firendliness and cooperation.
  - c. The battalion continued saturation petrolling and searches of Breas in an attempt to net VC. Often the battaliants offensive endeavors were favorable in that the searches resulted in the apprehension and destruction of confirmed Viet Cong and his logistical support.
  - d. On 2 August 1965, the battalion executed 3d Bn 3d Marines Operation Order 9-65 which was a defensive order assigning missions to the companies within the assigned TAOR. On 6 August 1965 the battalion executed 3d Bn 3d Marines Operation Order 10-65 which was a two day search and destroy operation in conjunction with elements of the 51st Regiment, 2d ARVN Division, and the 3d Vietnamese Marine Battalion. Operation Plan 11-65 provided for a night helicopter operation on the TRUNG PHAN Peninsula, however, it was not executed due to a lack of available aircraft. On 14 August 1965, 3d Bn 3d Marines Operation Order 12-65 was executed ordering a helicopter operation on the TRUNG PHAN Peninsula. The mission was to conduct daytime search and destroy operations and night platoon ambushes. 3d Bn 3d Marines Operation Order 13-65 was published but never executed because of other operational commitments. On 17 August, the battalion executed RLT-7 Operation Order 323-65 which was further amplified. by 3d An 3d Marines Operation Order 14-65. The operation consisted of an opposed amphibious landing and a search and destroy operation in an area heavily concentrated with Viet Cong.

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2. MISSIONS ASSIGNED

a. The tattalion continued to execute the rissions assigned in 4th Marines





Frag Order #10-65 of 25 July 1965. Until 27 August 1965, these missions were:

- (1) Occupy and defend along the trace of the MLR in the left seater of the Regimental TAOR.
  - (2) Maintain OPLR's within sector.
- (3) Maintain traffic control point to check and control movement of civilians and vehicles through the sector.
- (4) Provide liaison personnel to effect positive coordination with the 2d ARVN Division Quang Ngai.
  - (5) Provide one (1) Rifle Company as Regimental Reserve.
- (6) Conduct and maintain surveillance of seaward approaches within sector, repel overt landings and prohibit infiltration.
- (7) Be prepared to provide one (1) battalion (-) on order for employment as a reaction force to be helilifted or road transported anywhere in the Division Zone.


# 3. OPERATION FARTICIPATION

- a. During the reporting period the majority of the offensive actions enacted by the battalion were in the form of saturation patrolling of the assigned TAOR.
- (1) On 6-7 August 1965, the battalion participated on Operation THUNDERBOLT. The mission was to search out and destroy all Viet Cong and his logistical support. The operation netted six (6) VC captured. Weapons captured included two (2) carbines and four (4) bounding type mines.
- (2) On 17-20 August, 3d Bn 3d Marines executed Operation STARLIGHT.

  The mission entailed making and amphibious assault landing followed by a rapid movement inland to seek out and destroy the Viet Cong. The battalion killed 215 VC and captured 20 POW's during this operation.

#### 4. TERRAIN AND WEATHER

a. Terrain. Terrain within our TAOR is accurately configured on the TRI BINH and SON TRA maps (Series L701, Sheets 6757III and 6757II, compiled by the Army Map Service). As seen, it is gently rolling sand dunes, interspersed with small pine trees, rice paddies, stone temples and huts. Vest of the Song Tra Bong River, reads have been constructed which permit vehicular traffic to most areas. The highest hill within the TAOR is 141 meters and is located on the East shore of the Trung Phan Peniasula. The terrain east of the Song Tra Bong is rougher and has a heavy growth of underbrush on the high ground.





b. Weather. During the month of August there was no rain until the 26th, but from the 26th through the 31st, 5.63 inches of rain was recorded. Temperatures ranged from 70 degrees Fahrenheit to 100 degrees Fahrenheit with a mean temperature of 87 degrees and an average humidity of 78%. Predominate surface winds were from East 5.23 East at eight (8) knots. Cloud cover during daylight hours has been minimal permitting almost continuous air operations. Precipitation and cloud cover greatly increased during the latter part of the month, and it is expected to continue increasing through the month of September and October at which time we anticipate the monsoon season. The most reliable estimates indicate the average annual rainfall for this area is about 70 inches.

# 5. MORALE AND DISCIPLINE

a. Food Service. All companies are maintaining individual messes capable of serving "A" or "B" rations as provided by the battalion mess. Both quality and quantity of food has increased greatly during the reporting period. Morale in this area: Excellent.

#### b. Liberty and R&R Program

- (1) There is no liberty in the Chu Lai area due to logation and operational requirements.
- (2) The R&R program for this battalion had a quota of 114 for the month. The program is running smoothly. Morale in this area: Excellent.
- c. <u>Mail Service</u> Mail service is on a daily basis but still out of sequence. The granting of the free nail privilege has given a great boost to morale. Morale in this area: Excellent.
- d. Pay. The men are paid regularly but usually draw only enough for PX supplies and beer. Signing of the pay bill has increased morale. Morale in this area: Excellent.
- e. PX Supplies. All units are serviced by the PX truck. PX supplies remain poor in selection and quantity. Morale in this area: Poor.
- f. Religious Services. Religious services are held each Sunday for both Protestants and Catholics. Attendance is good and consistant with operational requirements. Morale in this area: Good.
- g. Special Services. Due to the displacement of the Battalion CP special service facilities are practically nonexistant. Morale in this area: Poor.
- h. <u>Discipline</u>. Disciplinary actions continue to be reduced. Morale in this area: Excellent.

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
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2 August 1965. Companies conducted patrols and ambushes forward of the HEL.

Co "M" moved to the MLR and Co "K" reverted to Regimental Reserve. Co "I"
moved by LVT to the THUNG PHAN Peninsula in an attempt to locate the mother of
a girl wounded in an encounter with the VC on 31 July. The search proved negative.

One (1) platoon from Force Recon was left on the peninsula where they gathered
intelligence on any enemy movement.

3 August 1965. Companies conducted active patrolling to the front of the MLR. A detachment from 1st Force Recon (-) operated during the day on the "RUNG PHAN Peninsula. Arty furnished Hal fires throughout the night within the assigned Battalion TAOR. Co "h" was assigned an alert posture to recover Force Recon elements from the TRUNG PHAN Peninsula. At 031920H Recon requested to be evacuated from peninsula (BT 625002) when confronted with a force of twenty-three (23) armed VC. Two (2) platoons of Co "M" were dispatched, but were unable to make contact with the now dispersed VC. At 032000H Co "M" returned to the Bn CP with the Recon Team. At 032005H a second Force Recon Team was retracted from (BS 628975) at which time the belicopter in LZ received \$A fire from (BS 629973).


A August 1965. Companies "I", "L", & "M" conducted patrols and ambushes along and to the front of the MIR. Company "M" with the Battalion Chaplin moved to the TRUNG PHAN Peninsula in LVT's to search for the mother of a young girl wounded on the 31st of July. The search proved fruitful and the mother was brought back and reunited with her daughter. Artillery provided H&I fires throughout the night within the assigned TAOR.

5 August 1965. Companies "I", "L", & "M" again conducted patrols and mushes along the MLR. The battalion made preparations for the execution of Operation Order 10-65. At 051940H arty fire was delivered on VCS unloading a bost at (BT 644052). Thirty-six (36) rounds were fired with good effect on target area.

6 August 1965. Companies saintained accurity on the MIR. At 060700H the battalion executed Operation Plan 10-65. (Operation "THUNDERBOLM"). Cols "I" & "K" occupied the vacated positions of Companies. "I" & "M". on the MIR. At 060823H Co "I" reported being at 12 Wolf and capturing one (1) VCS at (BS 518858). At 060954H, Co "M" reported receiving SA fire from village of TRA BINH (BS 535858). No casualties. At 060950H Co "N" reported being on objective "A" with four (4) VCS that had been captured vic (BS 548858). Co "I" also reported discovering seven (7) packs (BS 536859). At 061110H, ARWA L19 reported a

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platoon of VC moving in a column South vic (BS 510875). At 061317H Co reported finding three (3) packs with clothes and food and one (1) carbine with five (5) magazines at (BS 552961). A second carbine was found at (BS 534857) on a dead VC. At 061335H, Company "I" reported receiving twelve (12) rds SA fire vic (BS 532865). No casual ties. Co "I" also reported finding eight (8) bounding type mines at same coord. Engineers destroyed all eight (8). At 062010H, Co "I" reported two (2) Marine WIA's from books trap. One (1) was evacuated and to other returned to duty. At 062330H Co "E" on the MLR reported one (1) Marine with light graze in upper right forearm. WIA occurred as a result of a strap round from PF fire-fight at (BS 565994).

7 August 1965. The bettelion continued the execution of Operation THUNDERBOLT, Operation Cuder 10-65. At 070930H Company "L" uncovered a chinese fragmentation grenade at (BS 585855). It was not booby trapped. Operation THUNDERBOLT concluded at 071330H. During the operation Companies "K" and "L" maintained security on the ETR supported by tanks.

8 August 1965. Companies conducted patrols and ambushes along the MLR. Co "M" conducted a squad size emphibious patrol along the SUNG TRA BONG River, searching 160 sampans.

9 August 1965. Companies conkinued to patrol and set ambushes along the MIR. Company "L" prepared a static rifle company display in preparation for General WESTMORELAND'S which to CHU LaI on 10 August. At 092245H OP #1 received SA fire. One (1) VC was killed. Artillery provided illumination during the encounter.

10 August 1965, At 100245H, four (4) tanks and three (3) LVT's moved 2500 meters West down the beach in an effort to force any VC in the area to move into previously established ambush positions located (BS 603013) and (BS 582977). Co "L" provided a streed display for General WESTMORELAND's visit at the CHU LAI airstrip.

11 August 1965. At 106451 Co "I" commenced search and destroy operations on the TRUNG PHAN Peninsula. The company received several rds of SA fire during the operation, and arry was called for and delivered with good effect on two (2) occasions. Security of the MLR remained the responsibility of Co's "I" and "with Co "K" in Regimental Reserve. At 111800H, in the evening resupply run, one (1) helicopter received sniper fire from (BS 629992).

12 August 1965. Co "I" was retracted from a successful search and destroy operation on the THUNG PHAN Peninsula at 120800H. Security of the MIR was maintained. The Division Commander inspected Co "M" on the MIR.

13 August 1965. An orientation tour was conducted at the MAG-12 complex and the 12th Marines area to allow 3/3 Cfficers and SMEO's to become more familiar with supporting arms units. Security was maintained on the MLR.

14 August 1965. At 140847H Co "M" landed by helicopter on the TRUNG PHAN Peninsula (BT 666996) and commenced search and destroy operation. Humarous pieces of equipment were captured the most notable being a Russian HE Rocket Launcher with two (2) rds of amountaion. Patrols and ambushes were conducted along the MLR. Co "K" remained in Regimental Reserve.





15 August 1965. Companies "I" and "L" maintained security on the MR. At 150230E to "I" sent a platoon to the vic (BS 553998) to form a blocking position for a morning search of TRI BINE (1) (BS 555981). At 150600H the remainder of the company searched the named with negative results. Company "M" was retracted from the TRUNG PHAN Peninsula at 151350E. Patrolling on the West side of the SONG Tan BONG River produced negative results.

16 August 1965. The battalion continued active patrolling along the MLR and West of the SUNG TRA BONG River. During the night tanks were utilized to provide H&T fires. At 160320M lat Phat Co "l" received one (1) grenade at (BI 549013). No casualties were sustained.

17. August 1965. An 1710 OH Company "I" boarded IVW's and departed for the Thing Phal Teninguis we conduct search and destroy operations and to take up blocking position is equipmential, as a community of the battalien bose at 1, 3, Naval shaps during the late afternoon and evening and sailed for the objective error.

18-19 August 1945. Opension STAMMIGHT started as a routine search and destroy operation, which escalated into a ELT offensive action. At 160670H the BIM landed with Company 'I' on the loft flank and Company "X" on the right in LVT's. Company "B" in reserve landed in LCT's and LCM 8's. Fanks and Ontos were also landed in the scheduled waves. Brisk action centified during the day and at 181600H Company "I" 3d Battalion, 7th Mamines landed and were placed under operational control of BLM 3/3. On the morning of the 19th BLM 3/3 required a Frag Order numerowing its zone of action to the east and continuing the attack to the sen in some. The battalion jumped off to the north with Company "k" on the left, Company "L" on the right and Company "B" 3/7 in reserve at 1907COH. The zone of action was prepared with haval gunfire and artillery prior to the commencement of the attack. The battalion moved forward against sporadic resistence which became intense during the late morning hours. Heavy concentrations of air, artillery and naval gunfire were employed to silence VC defenders, and the battalion returned to the previous nights' position.

During the night, heavy Hall fires were provided by artillery and naval gunfire.

20 August 1965. The battalion continued operation STARLIGHT. No enemy fire was received on the return every to beach GREEN. The battalion was relieved by 1/7 and returned by U. S. Newy Ships to CHU LAI. It returned to defensive positions on the NUR and continued patrolling between the MIR and the SONG TRA BONG River. The only contact during the night was carbine fire received by a Co "M" patrol via (BI 605015). We pasculties were reported. Full information on Operation STARLIGHT is contained in After-action Report #33.

21 August 1925. The Battalion continued to improve defensive positions along the Mark Companies conducted ambushes forward of their positions.

22 August 1965. Active patrolling was carried out by all units. At 221030H a plateon of Company "M" and three squads of Engineers with mine detectors searched the beach area from our MLR to the SONG TRA BONG River for indications of mine emphasement. Reports had been received of large number of VC moving North from BLET SON with intentions of mining the page number of VC moving Negative.

23 August 1965. The battalion continued to improve defensive positions along the MLR. Co "I" moved to Regimental Reserve and Co "k" occupied its vacated positions on the MLR: active patrolling to the front of the MLR was carried out.

24-25 August 1965. All units continued to improve defensive positions along the MLR. At 250830H Co "L" reported receiving one (1) round sniper fire at (3T ; 573017). No casualties. At 252140H Co "K" received one rd SA fire (BT 555001). No casualties. Active patrolling to the front of the MLR was carried out.

26 August 1965. The battalion continued extensive patrolling forward of its MLR. During the day-light hours Co "L" conducted a search and clear operation on the TRUNG PHAN Peninsula. At 261300H at (BT 655006) an empty cave about twenty (20) feet long was destroyed by Engineers attached to Co "L". There was no enemy contact and the company returned to the MLR at 261500H. At 261855H Co "K" apprehended three (3) VCS at (BT 558014) and delivered them to the collection point.

27 August 1965. The battalion was relieved on the MLR by 1st Bn, 7th Marines Companies were moved into a tactical bivouac benind the MLR.

28 August 1965. The 1st Bn, 7th Marines completed relief of the MLR. Three (3) companies were in a tactical bivouac behind the MLR and Co "I" remains in Regimental Reserve.


29-30-31 August 1965. The battalion continued to assume the defensive responsibility for the Western to the Northern end of the airfield with Co "I" and two (2) platoons from Co "L". The remainder of the battalion remained in a tactical bivouac. Each company sent nine (9) narines to a 60mm Mortar School being conducted by the 81mm Mortar Platoon.

2. General. The battalian (-) (Rein) conducted a search and destroy operation in an area as indicated on appended overlay. The entire battalian (-) (Rein) was helilifted to and from the must of operations.

a. At 060706H the habitalion (-) bearded helmopters at LZ LOON (BT 568022) and moved to LZ WOLF (appointed overlay). At 050810H the entire battalion(\_) was Landed and executing 3/3 Operation Order 10-65. At 060823H Company-"I" found one (1) VC hiding in a stream (BS 529854). At 060823h Company "M" began receiving small arms fire from TRA BINH (BS 553858). The company quickly returned fire and briefly had the VC pinned down at (BS 540860); however, the enemy finally filtered into the dense undergrowth that characterized the terrain. At 060930H, Company "I" moved on to TRIBINH and found several packs containing clothes, medicine, VC uniforms; food, cooking utensils and toilet articles at (BS 533857); four (4) VGS vore apprehended in the vicinity of the packs. At 061120H Company "I" found one (1) wounded VC at (BS 534687) and evacuated him (DOA) back to the Br CP. At 061200H three (3) more packs with clothing and food along with one (1) carbine and five (5) magazines were found in the vicinity (BS 552861). At 061202 a second cartine was found while searching the immediate vicinity of the wounded VC previously mentioned. At 061230H Company "I" received several rounds of small ams fire (BS 532865). Fire was returned with movisible results. At 061241H Company "M" found eight (8) land mines (BS 547856); four (4) of them antipersonnel bounding type and four (4) home made mines. All were destroyed in place by Engineers. The battalion moved on to the night defensive positions vicinity (BS 570864) without further incident arriving at 061640H. At 061700H the resupply and Howter's for the night defense, arrived. During the preparation of the night defense, Company "I" received two (2) WIA's at 061712H fro a pressure type mine vicinity (BS 572858). One man was evacuated, while the other Marine incurred only superficial wounds and was returned to duty. Throughout the night, the battalion conducted h&I fires expending 158 Howter rounds and thirty-two (32) 81mm rounds. No contact was made with the enemy during the night. At 070730H, the battalion moved onward to Phase Line FOXTROT (appended overlay) arriving at 071325H. The entire movement from the night defensive positions to the conclusion of the operation was conducted without incident.


At 071337H the battalion began helilifting back to the MLR. The retraction was completed by 071515H.


#### 3. Remarks

- e. The mone of action assigned for this operation was toolarge for the battalion to adequately cover. The terrain and vegetation was such that two (2) companies were unable to conduct a thorough search in the time allowed.
- b. HOWTLRS were to be brought into the night defensive positions at a time to be designated. They were brought in early and before the battalion was ready to receive them. This resulted in confusion and congestion of air traffic in the landing zone.
- c. Auxiliary water cans should be kept on helicopters that are used for succustions. When a Marine succumbs to heat exhaustion his companions use all their water to cool him off and give him comfort; consequently, several Marines are leftwithout water and they become potential heat casualties. This becomes a vicious circle. If water cans were carried on the helicopters men could refill their canteens on the spot. Provisions would have to be made for recovery of water cans.
- d. Communications maintenance is essential. During this operation ', six (6) AN/PRC-10's ceased to function for a variety of reasons. Three (3) of these were put back into action by a technician in the field. This is a desireable practice and is recommended for future operations. Only a small quantity of tools must be carried for quick field repair.
- e. Aerial photographs were invaluable for planning. It is recommended that photos of the area of operation be made available to company commanders in the amount of two (2) copies per company.
- f. One interpreter per company is inadequate for offensive operations over a wide zone of action. He is just not there when needed, because he is involved with some other platoon. One (1) interpreter per platoon is considered satisfactory.
- g. Helicopter availability was changed at the last moment and the battalion was not notified. This necessitated a change of the landing plan at the loading zone.
- h. While representatives from various news media are always welcome, it is felt that the battalion should be advised as to how many are expected to appear. Heliteams are planned ahead of time and unexpected riders merely confuse the issue.

2. General. Company "I" conducted search and destroy operations on the TRUNG PHAN Feninsula. The company was carried to the peninsula by LVT's and retracted by helicopter.

a. At 110845H Company "I" landed at (BT 653037) and began moving inland on a search and destroy operation. At 111000H the company moved to (BT 646009) where a brief fire fight was held with an estimated four (4) VC. No casualties were incurred. The fire fight was almost coincidental with a brief skirmish at (BT 651011) where S-2 scouts also received small arms fire. Although the VC escaped, one of the enemy did drop his ID Card. The company was taken under fire from a hill (BT 650005). An attempt was made to encircle the hill, however: the enemy, two men comercd in brush were able to escape into the dense underbrush. At 111130H sniper fire was received from vicinity (BT 656000). No casualties. The company moved onward with scouts covering the forward movement and were taken under fire at (BS 653994) from the vicinity of (BS 659992) where an armed VC in black clothes was seen retreating. The village of DONG LE (4) (BT 660015) was searched but met with negative results. The company moved to (BS 657999) were tunnels were found and blown. At (BS 639988) the company again received small arms fire. The enemy escaped through the brush and into a village at (BT 630003). Small arms was received and VC were sighted at (BT 623004), artillery fire was called in on the VC position and the company made an assault. During the course of action, the Marines received two (2) WIA's. At 111615H, the company CP at (BS 635000) received small arms fire and five (5) rounds of 60mm mortar fire. No casualties. Artillery was directed on to the suspected VC position. One (1) Marine received a minor wound by small arms during the incident. At 111845H vicinity (BS 631986) during the resupply, the company received heavy small arms firefrom (BS 630995). The VC were able to escape again. There was no further action until 120540H when the ambush at (BS 632984) opened fire on six (6) VC. The VC escaped however one man was believed wounded. At 120640H while moving from (BS 632984), the company was taken under a heavy volume of fire from an estimated VC squad at (BT 633984). Fire was returned with no observed results. The company began retraction by helicopter at 120810H and was completed by 120910H.

#### 3. Remarks

a. The VC were willing to snipe at the Marines and were well prepared in that they had excellent avenues of escape whenever the Marines gave chase.

b. Communications hindered effective pursuit in that during the maneuvering of the elements of the company, communications was often negligible. A reliable radio for distances to five (5) miles is required for company, platoons, and squads.

#### 4. Recommendations

- a. That ambush sites not be predetermined, rather the sites should be picked during movement in daylight hours and the size of the ambush be set by the terrain and action of the day.
- b. That company operations be 3 7 days in duration. Flexibility is lost by trying to most time schedules for resupply and evacuation from an operation area.




Nature of Action: Operation STARLIGHT

2. During the aforementioned period, the battalion participated in Operation STARLIGHT, an operation which started as a routine search and destroy mission, but which escalated into a BLT offensive action. The first element of BLT 3/3 to approach the objective area was Company "M" which landed by LVT across a beach to the north in the vicinity of (BT 650034) on D-1 at 171000H and commenced movement overland by foot. The remainder of the BLT embarked aboard amphibious shipping and sailed for the objective area during the afternoon and night of 17 August 1965. Company "M" established a blocking position vicinity (BS 683971) at about 180600H (H-30min) and the BLT landed across Beach GREEN vicinity (BS 718922) at H-hour (180630H) with Company "I" on the left (Beach CREEN ONE). Company "K" on the right (Beach GREEN TWO) in LVT's and Company "L" in recerve 1 inded in LCU8s and LCM8s. Tanks and Ontos were also linded in the schedled waves by KP tend LCM's. A large charge of explosives was detonated on the beach in front of Company "I" on landing, however it had no effect and the Company pushed on through the sub-hamlet of AN CUONG (1) vicinity (BS 717922). Company "K" moved through the northern edge of the sub-haplet without incident and secured Hill 22 (BS 715924) Company "L" in the second wave received heavy small arms fire from the right flank of the beach on landing. The company was immediately committed to the attack toward Phase Line APPLE and the firing ceased. Two Marines were slightly wounded. Compenies "I" and "K" continued their movement westward. Company "K" turned to the northeast in the vicinity of (BS 708928) and moved toward Phase Line APFLE. Company "I" executed a flanking movement to the northeast in the vicinity (BS 702922) and was taken under heavy small arms fire from the left flank in the 2/4 zone of action (BS 703923). The company was directed to attack the source of the fire (aN CUONG (2)(BS 701928)) reenforced by a heavy section of

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Frag Order narrowing its zone of action to the east, and BLT 3/7 (-) was assigned the mission of recovering the LVT's. BLT 3/3 was assigned the mission of continuing the attack to the sea in zone. The battalion jumped off to the north with Company "K" 3d Bn 3d Marines on the left, Company "L" 3d Bn 3d Marines on the right a nd Company "L" 3d Bn 7th Marines in reserve at a proximately '190700H. The zone of action was propared with naval gunfire and artillery prior to the commencement of the attack. The tattalion moved toward the beach, against sporadic resistance, As the force reached Phase Line CHERRY Company "L" 3d Bn 3d Marines, Company "K" 3d Bn 3d Marines and the battalion command **enough came und** intense small arms and mortar fire from (BS 712957). The battalion moved quickly to the dune line just inboard of the beach and returned the fire. Artillery and air strikes were called in on the VC positions and the fire ceased. At 191710H after intensive preparation of the zone of action by air, artillery, and naval gunfire, BLT 3/3 continued the attack to the south with Company "L" 3d Bn 7th. Marines on the left, Company "L" 3d Bn 3d Marines in the center, and Company "K" 3d Bn 3d Marines on the right. On arrival at Phase Line BANANA the BLT estab. lished a defensive perimeter at BS 713943. Company "K" 3d B n 3d Marines and Company "L" 3d Bn 3d Marines closed at a pproximately 191855H. Company "L" 3d Bn 7th Marines was delayed due to evacuation of heat casualties.. A platoon from Company "L" 3d Bn 3d Marines was attached to the company for assistance and the entire unit arrived in the BLT area at 192140H. A defensive posture was maintained during the night with heavy H&I fires being provided by artillery and navall gunfire. The following morning patrols were sent out from each company to locate any by-passed VC pockets of resistance. All returned reporting no contact. At approximately 201050H Company "K" 3d Bn, 3d Marines, Company "L" 3d B n 3d Marines and the Executive Officers group commenced movement southward toward Beach GREEN arriving without incident at 201240H. The Commanding Officer Group, Company"L" 3d Bn 7th Marines and the 3d Plat, Company"B", 3d AT Bn remained to receive BLT 1/7 and guide them into position. BLT 1/7 commenced landing at approximately 201330H and the Commanding Officers Group of BIT 3/3 commenced movement to Beach GREEN at 201440H arriving at 201550H. Retraction followed shortly and the BLT set sail for CHU LAI aboard LST 1161.

#### 3. Remarks.

a. During Operation STABLIGHT, RIF 3/3 used naval guns extensively for preparatory fires, illumination and flushing fires. The BIT was supported quite satisfactorily by the naval guns as far as accuracy and volume were concerned. The illumination is excellent. The time required to obtain the first round of naval gunfire was often toolong due to the requirement of positioning the ship. It is believed this discrepancy will not exist in operations where the planning phase is longer than thirty-six (36) hours. However, anticipating that other operations will be undertaken on short notice, it is recommended that this important supporting arm be given all possible planning time. On the evening of D+1 the fire support ship that had been registered was changed after dark. Re-registration was required and was a difficult task. It is recommended that once a ship has the night defensive fires laid in and has howed to, she should not be changed unless out of annunition.









b. Artillery support, while extremely effective once delivered, was slow to the point of being unsatisfactory because of so much traffic on the conduct of fire net. The only agencies a single conduct of fire net should be the supporting battery, the FO's and the liaison team. BLT 3/7 and BWT 3/3 were both on the same conduct of fire net and was to difficult to enter the net when fire missions were required. It is recommeded that on future operations each BLT have its own conduct of fire net.

- c. Wide zones of action are permissable on routine search and destroy operations, however there is a definite need for a naneuver element when the BLT neets resistance. If the BLT is assigned a wide zone of action it has a choice of two courses of action. It may put all available companies on line for a more thorough search or it may keep one element in reserve therby decreasing the efficiency of the search. Usually the former course of action is preferred. On future operations where contact with a strong enemy force is expected it is recommended that a narrow zone of action be assigned so that a thorough search can be conducted and so that a maneuver element may be available for reaction to heavy resistance.
- d. Preparatory fires were used extensively on D+1 with excellent effect. It is recommended that preparatory fires be used to the maximum extent practicable on future operations to reduce friendly ossulties. It is also recommended that fires be delivered behind the advancing unit to discourage snipers from shooting from the rear.
- e. Close air support during Operarion ST\_RaiGHT was very good. Aircraft were available, there was a minimum of delay, and pilots were on target. U. S. Marine close air support was the most responsive supporting arm during the operation and it was a distinctpleasure for all hands to observe such accurate and timely support. There were four occasions of mindly aircraft dropping bombs or strafing too close to friendly lines, however, no serious casualties occurred

2. General. Company "I" landed over the South (left) portion of Beach GREEN to conduct a search and destroy operation against the Viet Cong. Company "I"s mission was to sweep the village of AN CUONG (1) pushing in a westerly direction until contact was made with the right flank of 2d Bn 4th Marines. When contact was made in the area of coordinates (BS 703926), the company mission was to make a flanking movement, sweeping generally in a north northwesterly direction reaching by the end of the first day the ocean in the area of coordinates (BS 717958). The next day resweeping the same area.

a. At 180730H Company "I" landed over the southern portion of Beach CREEN. An explosion occurred just as the ramps were dropping on the LVT's. No one was injured. The company formed on line and proceeded to search the village. The only significant find was communication wire running from the explosive point to a trench line 150 meters to the rear. It appeared as if an electrical charge was set off to disrupt our landing. After searching the village the dompany moved out to the west and discovered a covered arench line, which lead to two cave systems, at (BS 714923). A search of the caves revealed only digging tool: The company continued forward and started its turning movement to the Borth at (BT 702922). At this point an air strike occurred to our right flank and the company held up. Two (2) superficial WIA's were sustained at this time. It is suspected that the injury's were the results of bonh fragment. Lifter the strike, the company continued its sweep to the North. The company began receiving heavy fire from the village of AN CUONG (2) (BS 700928). The fire was returned and permission from Battalion Commander was requested to cross over into 2/4 sector and engage the enemy in this village. During this time we were accompanied by three (3) tanks from Co "A" 3d Tanks who were protected by a squad from the 1st Plat Company "I". After receiving permission from the Battalion Commander to sweep AN CUONG village, the tanks were sent down a trench line that stretched East to West bordering the Southern edge of the village, 1st plat was deployed on the left, 2nd on the right and the third in reserve. The 1st and 2nd plateons assaulted the trench line and into the village along with the tanks who reached the trenchline and were unable. due to the width of the trench line, to advance further. As the 1st and 2nd plats

entered the village the CP group followed close behind. At this time a concealed Viet Cong threw a grenade which killed the Company Commander. and wounded three (3) others. Following the grenade explosion two (2) rounds of 60 mm mortars fell in the area wounding the artillery FO and the two (2) FO's from 81's. At this time the Company Executive Officer assumed command of the company. After contacting the Battalion Commander, the company was instructed to continue the attack to the north. Before continuing the attack a Marine UH-1E helicopter landed to our immediate rear with its gas tanks full of bullet holes. Upon instruction of Battalion, a ten (10) man squad was left to protect the UH-1E, as were the tanks. which were unable to cross. the trench line. We were under no fire at this time and counted approx 30 VC dead in the trench line and village. The company moved through the village and proceeded north, shifting slightly to the east back into the company 2/1 We received only occasional sniper fire until we rejoined Company "K" and the Battalion Headquarters Group at approximate coord (BS 711939). Upon arriving at the area of the Bn CP the company was ordered to board Amtracs and Ontos to return to grid coordinates (BS 720928) where the Bn Supply point was set up under the direction of the Bn Executive Officer. "I" Company's mission was to locate and attack the enemy force that had isolated a tank and LWT supply column. After a briefing by the Battalion Executive Officer it was decided to proceed down the trail to the west back to the village of AN CUONG (2), coord (BS: 700928) where Company "I" had left the three (3) tanks and two (2) squads to protect the helicopter. One (1) tank in the lead, followed by five (5) Amtracs and five (5) Ontos. As we got to the top of the ridge line coord (BS 703927) the lead tank was hit by a 57mm RR and stopped. We started deploying immediately while several 81mm mortar rounds dropped in on our , position. We immediately deployed around the vehicles but only a few sniper rounds were directed into our position. We then turned our attention to the wounded and called for helicopter evacuation. The results of the mortar barrage on the Amtracs resulted in five (5) deed and seventeen (17) wounded. After the first helicopters arrived, a small evacuation team was left behind to get the wounded out. The company then advanced to the edge of AN CUONG (2) vallage and covered the withdrawal of a platoon of Company "H" 2d Bn 4th Marines along with the three (3) tanks and two squads of Company "I" left behind to provide security for the downed helicopter earlier in the day. During the time Company "I" was going up to Company "K" positins several events occurred. The crew of the helicopter repared the gas leaks and dropped the rocket pods leaving instructions to the security personnel to blow the rockets. This was done with a team of engineers of Company "H" 2d Bn 4th Marines. After the pods were blown, one (1) platoon of Company "H" 2d Bn 4th Marines joined by three (3) tanks and two (2) squads from Company "I" proceeded to advance to the north whereupon they engaged a large force of VC at approx (BS 701931). After suffering several casualties they withdrew back to coord (BS 702927) where they were covered by Company "I" who arrived in the area. The casualties sustained in this engagement were fifteen (15) WIA and two (2) KIA. Since the helicopter evac landing zone was receiving increasing sniper fire Company "I" left back the 2d platoon for area security. At this time we were brought under 81mm mortar fire. An air strike on AN CUONG (2) village was called for but failed to arrive. The two (2) platoons of Company "I" then advanced west to coord (BS 698927) and began sweeping north in an attempt to locate the supply token when we engaged a VC force at coord (BS 700930) resulting in one (1)KIA and

one (1) WIA. The V.C. lost six (6) KIA. This contact occurred at around 1930. The V.C. broke contact and a helicopter evacuation was conducted for the two casualties. By the time the evacuation was completed it was dark. We were unable to locate supply train and were ordered to return back to Grid. Coordinates (BS 704927) where Compania "I'd" see not platoon and a platoon from Company "H" 2d Bn 4th Marines were located, then return back to the 7th MarinCP to previde security for the CP. Our return back was hampered by continuous il mination. We were fired upon on two occasions and returned fire. We surprised six (6) VC in the village and killed them and returned back to grid coordinates (BS 704927) around 190345H. There we gathered up our second platoon and a plt from Company "H" 2d Bn 4th Marines and proceeded back to the Regiment CP, and set up security. We stayed at the Regiment CP the 19th of August and retracted around 1700 20 August 1965

 Company "K" (Rein) landed on the right flank of Beach GREEN and was immediatelytaken under fire by automatic weapons from the extreme flank of the lst platoon searched right portion of village, AN CUONG (1) coord (BS 718924) the 2d and 3d platoon pushed through right half of beach neutralizing fire and proceeding inland in prescribed axis of advance. 2nd Plat secured high ground, located Coord (BS 712925) and 3d Pl.t secured high ground Coord (BS 715928). 1st Plat in reserve. 2nd Plat then moved forward and secured high ground located Coords (BS 709928). On order 2nd and 3d Plats moved out in a Northerly direction. At (BS 714938) 2nd and 3d Plats oads under heavy automatic fire from left flank and trench line directly in front. 1st Plat came from reserve and assaulted to left, 2nd Plat assaulted straight ahead over hill and 3d Plat moved up to hill on right flank. Company set in night defenses coord (BS 715942). After setting in, naval gunfire and air were called in on enemy troop concentrations located at (BS 714947) to (BS 718945). Arty was also called but never got on target. Naval gunfire was observed in area where troops were noted and numerous secondary explosions were observed as a result of one air strike. Naval gunfire was also used by Co "K" for H&I fires throughout the night. At 190700 Co "K" moved out to village located at (BS 710945) Prior to moving through the village and high ground located along (BS 711949) to (BS 713953) an air strike was called. Co K' passed through village and proceeded to high ground at above Coord. Prior to starting to beach, naval gunfire was called on (BS 708958) to (BS 711957). Arty and Air were also called in same area. While moving to beach located at (BS 701962), Co "K" came under fire at (BS 712961) lst Plat moved to clear high ground (BS 708961). 2nd and 3d Plats moved down beach and assembled vic coord (BS 727924). at 191730 and returned to previous nights defensive positions. Naval gunfire H&I were again used throughout night. At 201100H Co "K" moved and swept to beach GREEN and set in defensive positions along left flank. At 201500H Co "K" commenced back loading. See overlay to Operation Order 14-65 for overlay of operations.

3. Remarks. All hostile villages, trench lines, and ridge lines Should Be Prep'ed regardless of civilian casualties prior to jumping off. Company Tones of Action should be small enough to give Company Commander ability to

employ a manuevering element. Naval gunfire produced a salutory effect on all targets. Air Support was also commendable. Arry support was inefficient and delay time was inexcusable. Resupply by Amtrac proved not to be feasable and should not be planned more than 1000 meters inland. Zones of Action were to wide for thorough and proper search. Adjacent in Smust cover areas of responsibility and must not bypass large pockets of enemy activity. For future operations note prior planning be effected and more flexibility be shown in execution of Basic Order. No interpretors were attached to this unit.

2. At 180700H August 1965 Company "L" (Rein) landed in the center of Beach GREEN at (BS 718924). We immediately moved on the double to the right flank of the beach. The lat Plat was taken under fire by enemy in the tree line using small arms and at least one (1) automatic weapon. The remainder of the company still moving up the beach was also receiving fire. I moved the 3rd Platoon to the right to flank the fire and brought the 2nd Platoon into the center. Due to the crowded type landing, it took the platoon a short time to come on line and start advancing. To cover the hill I took an Ontos that was sitting on the right flank of Co "K" and noved him into the fire. His machine gun jammed and he started using his spotting rifle. The crew chief distinguished himself in this action and continually exposed himself to direct fire; He could not fire his 106's because of the closeness of the terrain and the troops behind the Ontos. To further cover the area I brought in a M-60 MG to the left of the Ontos. The Gunner was Pfc BOAST who also particularly distinguished himself by moving into the open on the top of a small hill into direct fire, where he calmly set in his MG with the incoming cutting the leaves around him. He opened fire and with fire from the Ontos. secured the incoming. We moved forward with three (3) platoons on line into our Zone of Action continually receiving light to moderate small arms fire. At coord (BS 718928) a very large cave net-work was found which was later blown by the Engineers. During this early action we received one (1) WIA. wounded slightly in the left upper arm, not evacuated. Under sporadic fire the company, three (3) platoons on line, moved across Phase Line APPLE. Between PL APPLE and PL BANANA, the company received fire from Hill #45 and to the Northeast (BS 720939). This fire was moderate and continuus. Fire was returned with 3.5, MG, and anall arms. In excess of twenty (20) VC were seen at one time or another moving on hill. The company was being held at this time. Artillery was called with poor accuracy, next 81's with some improvement. Ontos platoon arrived and the hill was raked, with good accuracy. When the con any was allowed to move forward, no further fire was encountered. Upon arrivel on Hill #45 with the 3d and 2nd Plat, I was called to WH 5

la as at this time noving to a s objective. As position. The 1st I was departing from my CP I (and my party) received accurate sniper fire from the area into which the 1st Plat was to move. I waited until 1st Plat had passed and then moved to WH 6 position. Company "L" next moved night position around 3/3 CP with Company "K". The morning of 19 mugust 1965, Company "L" jumped off with Co "K" and Co "L" 3/7 on a sweep to the sea. One (1) prisoner was taken (confirmed VC) and one (1) family desiring to emcaped the VC was picked up. Hostile fire was not incurred until the vicinity of coord (BS 726952 At this time the 1st and 3d Plat had already moved across to the sand dunes. At that time I told the 2nd Plat to investigate. They moved out into the open toward the fire followed by Lt BRUNAR. They continued to move under moderate fireuntil redirected by Lt BEDNAR toward the beach as they were moving into Company "K" area and L/3/7. I had no radio contact at this time with the lst or 2nd Plat. The 2nd Plat arrived in the beach area and joined with lat and 3d Plat. While at the beach, the company received light to moderate small arms fire that was fairly accurate. Fire was returned. Fire support was given to Co "K" until requested to secure. Sniper fire continued. at this point we received enemy mortar fire. A round landed in the 2nd Plat area, killing one (1) and wounding eleven (11). Lt SWARTZ immediately ran into the area and removed smoking WP 3.5 rounds from the vicinity to prevent further injury. The CP Corpsmen immediately went to the aid of the injured. They were evacuated. The two (2) corpsmen with the 2nd platoon were wounded but elected to remain with the company. The company started to sweep back to our previous position at 1700H. Half-wey back Sgt MOCRE and the 3rd Plat were detached and sent back to find and bring in Co "L" 3/7, which he did with great efficiency. The company set in for the night and the next morning swept the left flank of the road returning to the beach. Nothing remarkable was noted. Some additional packs were uncovered and a VC body. Numerous VC packs were encountered during the operation some with much explosive content. A VC claymore mine was also uncovered. While waiting on the beach, the 3d Plat was utilized to research the caves where documents etc. (including the body and claymore) were found. The company withdrew leaving the 2nd Plat as a rear guard.

 Company "M" (Rein) departed area at 171000H and proceeded to (BT 650034) by LVT's. Conducted search and destroy operations moving in Southerly direction moving in a tri-axis of advance along ridge lines (BS 656013) to (BT 667995) and (BS 650007) to (BT 658997) and valley floor between ridges. Receiving two (2) sniper rounds from approx (BS 663007) at 171430H. Could not make contact. Found one (1) M-1 and one (1) grenade w/out pin in "C" ration can at (BS 657998), it was destroyed. One (1) man was slightly wounded by Booky Trap grenade at (FT 652005) at 171505H. Spent night at (BT 667995) where we received two (2) sniper rounds which came from the Northeast from a long range. The company moved out at 180100H and proceeded to (BT 683971) where we arrived at 180420H. The area was secured and the Company proceeded to dig in. Whisky Btry started to arrive at 180930H. Security was provided. Co "G" 2/4 arrived at 181500 and set in to the West of the Company area. Day and night patrols were sent out during the entire period. One (1) Plat (Rein) patrol was sent out at 190630H with the mission of securing and establishing an outpost position at (ES 700975) while moving up the hill they sighted 12 VC moving along the ridge in a Southerly direction. They (the VC) were taken under immediate. fire and five (5) bodies were found when Marines reached the area. This Marine plateon probably was taken for a VC unit by 2/4 Marines as an air strike was run from the East to the West and although three (3) 350 lb bombs fell within 100 neters from the platoon, moone was hurt prior to our getting the air strike stopped. During the evenings of 18 and 19 August the Company and Btry was hit by 3" 58 Naval gunfire star clusters and HE shells. These did not explode and most were later destroyed. No further action took place on the 20th and the company started retraction by Helo at 201835H and the last unit arrived back in the Bn Area at 201925H.

#### 3. Remarks

a. Forcing troops to keep agreed out pays off. Only one man was wounded by the tripped booby trap.

#### PLANNING

Item:

Information must flow down as well as up.

Discussion:

The flow of information must go both ways. The battalion is required to submit timely, accurate and complete reports to higher headquarters. Liformation which flows down to the battalion should be of the same quality. When sightings of the enemy are made by aerial observers and relayed to battalion they should include such information as how many? In what direction were they traveling? Where were they sighted? Time of sighting, Were they armed? If not, how are they to be recognized? And so on.

Recommendation: That all staffs review their information flow and ensure that o complete, accurate reports are made.

Item:

The Linding Plan changed on the morning of D-day.

Discussion: Helicopter availability to U.S. Marines in South Vietnam may be described as "limited" at best; consequently, planning for a helilift must be detailed and thorough. The landing zones are selected in conjunction with the supporting helicopter squadron after a photo study and a detailed reconnaissance. The numbers and the timing of the movement is covered in of lifts needed in a detailed briefing of all participants. The success of the landing, particularly if it is opposed, depends upon this detailed planning. On Operation "Trunderbolt" this planning was accomplished On the morning of D-day ten newspaper correspondents appeared in . loading zone, that had not been expected; Aircraft from a squadron other than the one briefed arrived early in the loading zone and shut down, therby necessitating the briefed squadron's landing adjacent to the loading zone in an unmarked areas. This in addition to a change in the number of aircraft causel confusion in loading. Following a hasty modification to the landing plan the battalion embarked in helicopters, only to be landed in an area 900yards from the previously selected landing zone.

Recommendation: That changes to the handing Plan be produktated as soon as they are known so that supporting and supported units have a limit adequate time to monify plans. West minute changes can be essed by telephone notification of changes fter plans have been issued.

Iten:

There was no close mir support or direct artillery support for p battalion (-) withdrawal

Discussion:

Direct support artillery and close air support had been planned to cover the battation (-) withdrawl. This might be considered an excess of supporting axes but in this operation it was considered necessary. The withdrawal is the crucial name of a search and destroy operation outside of the TAUR. As the strength of friendly forces diminishes the threat of enemy attack increases and supporting arms must be available in the event of atwork. This support was not available to the degree required. Although armed UH-18 helicoptors covered the withdrawal, they are not considered to be

close air support in the sense that A-4 and F-4B aircraft are. The battalion discovered that the direct support artillery battery had displaced after the fact. Although the 155mm gun (SP) had the range to cover the battalion, and were in position to do so, these facts were not known by the Battalion FSC.

Recommendation: That all supporting arms available be used to cover withdrawals in future operations. That direct support units not
be withdrawn without notification to the supported unit. That
armed helicopters not be classified as close air support but
rather as escort type aircraft.

Item: Registration of indirect fire weapons was hampered by helicopter orbiting the battalion defensive position for no apparent reason.

Discussion: The battalion arrived in its night defensive area at 061700H.

By the time the last of the rations, water and ammunition cannot in it was about 061900H. This allowed about forty-five (45) minutes for registration of 107mm Howtars and 81mm Mortars.

During this period there were two (2) UH-34D and two (2) UH-1E helicopters orbiting the defensive position for me apparent reason attempts to communicate with these helicopters failed. Registration had to stop until the aircraft left the area. Consequently, registration was not completed until after dark.

Recommendation: That all aircraft in the battalion area be controlled by the supported unit and that the helicopters be responsive to directions from the ground.

#### MEDICAL

Itema

There were fifty-two (52) heat casualties during the course of the operation.

Discussion: The battalion moved forward during the hours 1200-1600 and incurred an inordinately large number of heat casualties. They seemed to occur all at once and for a period of time operations were of necessity suspended to facilitate their evacuation. It was noted that once a Marine became a heat casualty his companions expended their water to cool him off. Once the evacuate has left it was not long before these Marines with empty canteens succumbed to the heat. It is believed that if each helicopter would carry two (2) filled water cans to be dropped at the landing point when picking up a heat casualty, the problem could be materially alleviated. It is also believed that suspending operations during the hottest portion of the day, or conducting the major part of the operation at night, would reduce significantly the number of heat prostrations.

Recommendation: That arrangements be made with the helicopter squadron to carry two (2) water cans per aircraft to be unloaded when evacuating a heat casualty.

These cans could be recovered on the next trip to the area. That consideration be given to operating exclusively at night or at least to suspending operations during the heat of the day.

#### COMMUNICATIONS

Item:

Six (6) AN/PRC-10's ceased to function during the course of the operation. Three (3) of them were repaired in the field.

Discussion:

The battalion took a radio technician with a small amount of tools to the field and was able to effect repairs of three (3) of six (6) defective radios. The repairs were of a minor nature only, but were effected on the spot. Had the technician not been present the radios would have been evacuated and lost for the operation.

Recommendation: That a radio technician and a limited number of tools be taken on operations to effect field repair of inoperative radios.

Item:

The Tactical Air Direction not was cluttered with unnecessary traffic.

D; scussion:

During the course of the operation several attempts were made to obtain helicopters for heat evacuation. The efforts were hampered by unnecessary traffic on the TAD net. The UH-1E's were talking back and forth almost constantly and a great deal of the conversation was idle chatter.

Recommendation: That heavily trafficked frequencies be kept clear for necessary transmissions.

#### LOGISTICS

Item:

The battalion staged a water trailer in the loading zone so as to enable the emplaning Marines to top off their canteens before leaving.

Discussion:

Frequently Marines must walk one or two thousand meters to the loading zone; consequently, there is a drain on the canteens before they ever emplane. If a water trailer is emplaced in the loading zone the Marines may fill their canteens just before they load and be able to commence the operation with a full load of water.

Recommendation: That commanders consider staging a water trailer in the loading zone for each operation

Item:

There is a necessity for someone to work in battalion rear in order to see to the interests of each company and for resupply during an operation.

Discussion:

The battalion may work the resupply of comparies several ways.

ENCLOSURE (1)

One nethod that has proven successful has been to use the company property NCO in the battalion rear to supervise the acquisition, staging, and loading of supplies for his company. Once the surlies are loaded aboard the LVT or helicopter, the property NCO accompanies them to their destination and supervises distribution to the platoons. He then takes care of picking up and reloading empty water cans, and the like for return to base. This system works quite well and relieves the Marines in the field of the routine duties connected with the issuemes of communications gear, nhow water and other supplies.

Recommendation: That unit commanders consider using the aforementioned solution when planning extended field operations.

Item: Lister bags serve a useful purpose when conducting a water resupply mission.

Discussion: The battalion took lister bags out with the full five-gallon water cans to facilitate resupply. These lister bags were collapsed and placed on top of the water cans in the aircraft. When the water cans were unloaded, the lister bag was set up and filled immediately thereby enabling eight (8) Marines to fill their canteens at once with minimum spillage.

Recommendation: Use lister bags in conjunction with water resupply.

Item: There is a need for a means of marking 782 gear to avoid loss when casualties are evacuated.

Discussion: When casualties are heavy the problem of recovering 782 gear and returning it to the proper unit arises. If the gear is narked somehow, the process is facilitated.

Recommendation: That 782 gear, i.e. pack and belt, be tagged with the individuals name and company.

#### INTELLIGENCE

Item: One interpreter per company is simply not enough to react promptly to situations arising in villages during the conduct of a search and destroy operation.

Discussion: When searching villages and interrogating people, various situations present themselves such as persons volunteering information, suspicious persons who need interrogating, bunkers under houses which have to be checked, etc. Each of these situations require an interpreter to be present. When a company goes through a village the platoons are well dispersed and each of them encounter many of the aforementioned situations. One interpreter per company does not facilitate, but rather hinders, timely reaction to a given incident.

Recommendation: That sufficient interpreters be assigned to provide one per rifle platoon.

Iten:

Aerial photographs were used extensively for briefings and study.

Discussion:

Aerial photographs of the entire area of operations were obtained and studied at battalion level. They were then made available to commanders of subordinates units. They proved invaluable for briefings at the snall unit level. Also aerial photography lessens the necessity for aerial reconnaissance and thereby strengthens security.

Recommendation: That aerial photographs be made available on the basis of two (2) per company prior to all major operations.

Items:

There are many discrepancies on the maps we have, i.e. villages shown on the map are not there, hills and reservoirs are not shown on the map, and roads on the map turned out to be trails on the ground.

Recommendation: Maps should be checked carefully against recent aerial photos Prior to going on operations in areas outside of the TAOR.

MEASURES FOR HANDLING CAPTURED PERSONNEL, DOCUMENTS AND MATERIAL

- 1. General. Prisoners are one of the most valuable sources of information of the enemy. Officers and men will be instructed to capture prisoners whenever practicable. Humane treatment as prescribed by FM 27-10 (The Law of Land Warfare) will be the rule at all times. Indoctrination to this end will be conducted at all levels of this command.
- 2. Handling of Prisoners Upon Capture. Immediately after capturing prisoners, units will disarm, search, segregate and tag them.
- 3. Tagging. Tagging will consist of completing the standard POW/Equipment tag and affixing it to the prisoner. For the place of capture, give the locale and grid coordinates (e.g., In S edge of wds at AT637862). On the "Circumstances" line describe what the prisoner was doing when he was captured such as Member of MG Crew. Gun ran out of ammo. 3 other men in crew KIA". The "Capturing unit" sqd, 2d plt, A Co, 3d Mar.). When possible include the name of the individual making the capture. Including this data insures your unit of getting credit for capturing the prisoner. If the prisoner has any documents, mark X in the "Yes" section of the PW tag and fill in the DOCUMENT portion of the tag. Serial numbers will be printed in the upper right hand corner of the PW and DOCUMENT portions of the tag prior to issue for an operation. The numbers on the two portions will be identical, so the prisoner and his documents can be matched later.
- 4. <u>Prisoner Guards</u>. Troops detailed to evacuate and guard prisoners will be thoroughly schooled in the instructions contained in paragraphs 10 and 11.
- 5. <u>Wounded Prisoners</u>. Wounded prisoners requiring hospitalization shall be evacuated through medical channels with a report made to the this hattalion S-2, who will remove any documents and tag them. If the prisoner's condition permits, a tactical interrogation may be conducted.

- 6. Tagging of Documents. Tagging will consist of attaching and completing the DOCUMENT portion of the combination PW/DOCUMENT tag. When documents are found which cannot be identified with a FW or when it can be established that the owner/carrier was killed, the DOCUMENT portion of the tag only should be used, and the FW portion of the tag should be destroyed or crossed through. The CIRCUMSTANCES line should contain an explanation as to why only the DOCUMENT part of the tag is being forwarded in the intelligence channels.
- 7. Marking. In order to avoid defacement and possibility of misleading the analyst, documents will not be marked under any circumstances by subordinate echelons.
- 8. Guarding and Reporting. All items of equipment of an unusual nature will be guarded by the capturing unit and safeguarded in place with a report to this Headquarters (S-2). Where danger of recapture exists, every affect will be made to evacuate the equipment. If the equipment is too large to evacuate, all name plates and documents will be removed and forwarded with details of capture. Photos will be taken if possible and the equipment will be destroyed.
- 9. Souvenirs. Individuals desiring to retain documents as souvenirs will insure that they have their name on the CAPTURING UNIT line of the DOCUMENT tag and have checked the YES square. If documents are declared of no further intelligence value by Division Headquarters every effort will be made-to return the document to the capturing individual. Enemy material will not be returned as souvenirs by individuals unless a release slip is obtained from Division Headquarters. This slip must be fastened to the souvenir at all times. The purchase, sale or exchange of captured material which has not been designated as a souvenir is prohibited.

#### 10. INSTRUCTIONS TO TROOPS GUARDING PRISONERS OF WAR

- a. Maintain segregation of prisoners at all times.
- b. Prevent prisoners from discarding or destroying any insignia or document overlooked or not taken by the capturing unit. Guards bringing up the rear will be instructed to collect any documents dropped by the prisoners.
- c. Prevent anyone other than authorized interrogators from speaking to the prisoners.
- d. Prevent anyone from giving prisoners food, drink, or tobacco prior to interrogation. Prevent the PW from going to the head.
- e. Enforce silence among the prisoners at all times.
- f. Deliver the prisoners to the collecting point of this headquarters as soon as possible.

# 11. HE PREPARED TO ANSWER THE FOLLOWING QUESTIONS FOR THE INTERROGATOR-

- a. Has the prisoner been searched? If so, what was found?
- b. What condition is the prisoner's uniform in? What unit insignia and insignia of rank are on his uniform? Is there anything unusual about his uniform?
- c. Has the prisoner been fed, given water, tobacco, or allowed to go to the head?
- d. How has the prisoner acted during the time you were with him?
- e. What was the result of previous interrogation?

In the event that you turn a prisoner over to guard personnel at a collecting point or stockade tell these personnel all you know or have observed about the PW and tell them to pass this information on to the interrogator or Intelligence Officer.

The wounds were inadvertently brought about as a direct result of the small girl and three other civilians being used as human shields by five Viet Cong guerrillas. One round grazed her temple leaving a one and one half inch laceration. The second round entered her left posterior thigh, and exited through her

supra pubic area and left medial thigh. She was treated on the spot by a corpsman and evacuated immediately to BAS. Upon arrival in BAS, the girl was further treated by the Battalion Surgeons and evacuated to "B" Med, her location at this time.

- b. Several attempts were made to contact the girl's mother with eventual positive results. The contact was made on 4 August 1965 near GC 615016 by the Battalion Chaplain, who had left a note, with the local villagers in the hope that it would find its way to the girl's mother. Positive identification was made on the spot, by use of two Polaroid pictures of the child. The mother and grandmother were escorted to "B" Med and reunited with the young girl. Arrangements have been made for daily visits by the mother to "B" Med.
- c. An attempt is now being made to send the girl to either Danang or Saigon for plastic surgery and skin grafts.

## 8. Personnel Procedures

- a. This unit is not receiving evacuation messages from the various evacuation points. This is causing discrepancies and the forwarding of personal mail.
- b. The battalion has received various types of transfer orders from the Air Force hospital at Clark, Philippines. These orders are directing permanent change of station to CONUS but do not state a place of hospitalization. It is requested that the Commanding General, 3rd Marine Division, initiate correspondence to the various hospitalization points requesting they inform the Commanding General, 3rd Marine Division direct, when a patient is to be evacuated to CONUS. This would enable the division order writing section to direct/effect this move on a Division Special Order.

It is felt by the above procedures being established, it would allow the parent unit to report accurately, transfer by service record, ship personal effects and forward personal mail in a timely and expeditious manner, to the actual place the patient is to be interned.


